Maintenance is a big issue in everyday life. Paying attention to regular maintenance on your home, car, HVAC and appliances can extend their lifetime use, value and in the long run save money. Benjamin Franklin said, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." Taking care of the little things like changing filters, painting, annually draining your water heater, repairing leaks, etc can prevent you from paying big bills later.

The same is true for our bodies. Seeing the dentist twice a year, getting an annual physical, taking a long daily walk, getting adequate rest, eating good nutritious food and paying attention when your body tells you to sit down, find some shade and relax.

There is also great value in maintaining our spiritual life. Reading God's Word, spending time in prayer, being involved in Sunday School, worship and Bible Study. A friend of mine calls these spiritual exercises, "Being up-to-date with God.
