chocolate chip cookies for special occasions. They were about the size of a 50 cent piece. Once you started eating them, it was hard to

stop! I'm sure they were just like most everyone else's cookies but I have never been able to achieve the specific level of doneness that she did – not too gooey and not too hard.

Mom's not able to make the cookies anymore and many of the family members who used to travel to our house have passed away. We don't exchange gifts with her and I don't think we ever exchanged with extended family. But even without the presents, we celebrated. Because of God's presence on earth through Jesus Christ, we can celebrate Christmas. Mom didn't do all the cooking by herself, either. My aunt would do the turkey and my uncle would bring a country ham with him (he raised hogs and we always got the best one out of the smokehouse). Steve and whoever else was there knew where the extra tables and chairs were in the basement, so they took care of bringing them up. Mom provided the venue and paper goods and a couple of sides. Everyone else brought their best casseroles and homemade dishes. But we could always count on those cookies. And a delicious chocolate cake with boiled icing, Mom's specialty.

Now it has become our responsibility to establish traditions regarding big family meals. I had lots of help at Thanksgiving and I expect that I will enjoy help at Christmas as well. We haven't yet identified everyone's special dish but I'm sure we will before long. I don't have a formal dining area big enough for all of us but we managed at Thanksgiving with a table full in the kitchen and a few folks in the den...watching football. I didn't really appreciate the big Christmas dinner when I was younger – I had no clue what it took to pull one of those things off. But over the years, I have grown to really appreciate those family times. Long ago I realized that the presents weren't what brought families together. It's the present we share with others by just being present. It's the opportunity to celebrate the greatest gift of all with friends and family. And as I grow older, and face more of life's challenges, I know that God's presence in my life is something that should be recognized and celebrated. Isn't it great that the best gift of all doesn't need to be purchased or wrapped or even requested? He is here - in the past, in the present and forever. Christmas is a great season to spend some time reflecting on how God has shown Himself in our lives over the past year. God's gift of Himself is really the greatest and most enduring of all gifts.
