Service of Hope and Remembrance Wednesday, December 18 at 7:00pm Not everyone feels like singing "Joy to the Word" in the month of December. Job loss, missing loved ones who are not longer with us, illnesses, and broken relationships can feel even more pronounced this time of year. This reflective service provides a sacred space to set aside the busyness of the season. It allows for time to remember and to be

reminded of the hope for healing and reconciliation that we have in the coming of True Light that shines in darkness.

While in seminary, we were encouraged to pay attention to the Revised Common Lectionary (often referred to as simply "the lectionary"). Every Thursday afternoon, students and professors would gather for "lectionary lunch" where we would discuss the lectionary passages while munching on sandwiches and sipping on iced tea.

*What is "the lectionary"*? It is a three-year cycle of weekly scripture readings for worship services. Each week's readings include four scripture passages – an Old Testament reading, a Psalm, an Epistle, and a Gospel reading. Over the course of three years, the lectionary covers a large portion of the Bible.

*Who selects the lectionary passages?* It is done by a consultation committee of about thirty people from different denominations from all over the world. The lectionary passages are built around the seasons of the Church Year which reflect the life of Christ.

*Why follow lectionary*? Using lectionary ties our local worship to the worship of millions of Christians around the world who also follow lectionary. Even locally, if you have friends at Greystone, Millbrook, First Baptist, Ridge Road, or Woodhaven Baptist churches, we will all be hearing and reflecting on the same scriptures and themes. In addition, following the lectionary requires the pastor and the congregation to wrestle with passages that we might not choose to engage on our own – stretching and growing us as followers of Christ.

Why does all of this matter to you? In case you haven't already guessed it, starting this Sunday, 12/8, I will be following the lectionary – at least through the first Sunday after Epiphany (January 12). Each week, we will post the four lectionary readings for the following Sunday in the bulletin and in "The Valley Echo." I invite you to read and study those passages during the week to help prepare your hearts and minds for the worship service on Sunday. I would also love for you to come and talk to me about the passages during the week, because I will be studying them as well. While I will likely focus on just one or two of the four passages in the worship service, studying all four readings develops the discipline of reading scriptures that define the Christian faith. This can also deepen our understanding of the Church Year – and consequently the life of Christ. Advent blessings, Pastor Nola
