### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Joining God in His work is an exciting experience. It is the power of God that makes what seems impossible possible. Jesus himself said, "With Man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible (Matthew 19:26).

Over the past six months volunteer members of our church have been on a mission to explore the possibility of turning our Youth House into a Refugee Ministry (a temporary home for Refugees coming into our country"). We have visited the "Hope House Refugee Ministry" of Hope Valley Baptist Church in Durham and engaged in an in-depth conversation with Pastor Bill Bigger. We have had conferences with Dr. Roger Nix, Director of Missions of the Raleigh Baptist Association, Marc and Kim Wyatt, CBF Missionaries to the Triangle who have devoted their time to the Refugee Ministry. We have given up-dates through "The Valley Echo" to keep you informed. Last Wednesday night (July 12) we held a Town Meeting with the church family attended by 35 members, presented the partnership ministry, heard testimonies of how our volunteer members have moved from skepticism and doubt to conviction and faith that we can do this and answered questions regarding our participation in the mission project. Dr. Roger Nix offered valuable counsel and told us that it is small churches that engage in this type of ministry more so than large churches.

The Refugee Ministry is a PARTNERSHIP between the US Committee for Refugees and Immigrants, The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina and Crabtree Valley Baptist Church. Responsibilities of each partner in the ministry have been distributed and are available at the church.

During the Quarterly Business Conference on Sunday, July 23, 2017 following the Crabtree Café lunch, you will be asked to vote **by ballot** on the proposed Refugee Ministry. If you have unanswered questions, please contact me, or Ben & Barbara Best, Peninah Brown, Jean Glosson, Gene Sherwood, George Shore or Walt Switzer.

You need to know how God is already at work in this ministry. The cost of power washing the Youth House, painting the outside and repairing the ceiling in the bathrooms has been reduced by the contractor from \$13,000 to \$3,950. Baptist Men have volunteered to paint the inside of the house if we supply paint and supplies. The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of NC (CBFNC) has set aside \$2000 for this ministry. The Raleigh Baptist Association has set aside \$2,500 for this ministry. Volunteer Churches are eager to join us with furniture, contributions, prayers, etc. And, 3 members of our church have come forward to volunteer to serve on the CBF Hospitality Committee as representatives of our church. All this and we haven't even voted yet.

God is at work. The question before us as a church is this, "Do we see God at work and are we willing to join Him in the work that He is doing?
