When I turn on my laptop, I am reassured by a little box that pops up in the corner of the screen. It tells me that all my security programs are working and it is safe for me to proceed. Of course, I know that eventually some virus will make its way into my laptop and wreak havoc with my hard drive.

Knowing that my security program is up and running makes me feel that I've done all I can.

From where I am sitting, I can see the little red light on the panel of my home security system. I will often set it during the day if I am likely to be upstairs and unaware of things going on downstairs. I have screamed like a girl more than once when Steve has made it up to the third floor without me hearing him. (I think he secretly enjoys hearing me jump.) It's terrifying for a split second to hear an unexpected voice when you're home alone, even if they're just saying "I'm home". I have never had the system alarm go off for a legitimate reason, but I know it will warn me if somebody breaks in. I'm not sure what I'd do in the case of a break in but I will likely be armed with a pair of 8" dressmaker's shears and a razor sharp rotary cutter.

Other safety devices that I use are the dashboard of my car. I have lights that appear when my tire pressure is low or if there is a reason to "check engine". My dash will also tell me when the oil needs to be changed. Admittedly, when any of these warnings appear, they may as well say "tell Steve that...". There is a little red light that blinks whenever the car is parked indicating that there is an anti-theft device activated. The seat belt reminder will beep if you don't have your seat belt buckled. The car is equipped with air bags and tempered glass. There is a button you can engage to prevent the rear windows from being lowered completely so that a child cannot drop the window and fall out. I don't have to use that one since whenever Everett is in my car, he is strapped into a car seat like he's ready for lift off.

It sounds like I'm well protected, doesn't it? I know that I can only trust these devices so far. At some point, a virus will sneak into my laptop. If someone really wants to get into my house, there's not much I can do; they'll get in. Any one of the devices on my car can fail and leave me stranded on the side of the road. There is only one thing that will surely never fail me – God. That is not to say that nothing bad will ever happen to me. Assuring someone that "It'll be OK" really isn't helpful or true. Now if you say "You'll be OK", that is where God's protection comes in. There are bad things that will happen to us. He never promised that Christians will be protected from bad things. What He did promise is that He will be there for us no matter what. He will give us the strength to endure. The pain is there and we will surely feel it. But He will help us deal with it.
