From time to time we all have heard someone bragging that they are self made. The perception they want to transmit is that they got where they are today by their own efforts. Such thinking is at the best faulty and near sighted not to mention false.

None of us would have survived our birth had it not been for the care and nurture that others gave us. We were fed, clothed, sheltered and protected when

we could do nothing for ourselves. And along the way, we had parents or caretakers, teachers, family members, neighbors, doctors, ministers and a host of other people known and unknown to us who contributed to our wellbeing, development and survival.
