The Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of NC (CBFNC) celebrated its 20 year anniversary in Greensboro last week. Over the past few years, CBFNC has been looking at the road ahead and developing a vision report for the next 20 years. "A Vision for Christ-Centered Ministry in the 20th Century," which was presented last week, is not a statement of faith or a set of guidelines. Rather, executive coordinator Larry Hovis calls it "a navigational tool to help us discern the vision" and set the course for the future. The vision contains three overarching commitments: Transformation, Engagement, and Community.

- **Transformation**: "*Be transformed by the renewing of your minds*" (Romans 12:2) We serve a God who declares, "Behold, I am making all things new" (Revelation 21:5) Transformation is the work of the Spirit in the lives of Christians, congregations, mission partners, and the world. We desire to be agents of God's newness.
- **Engagement**: "*Be doers of the word*" (James 1:22) Our greatest potential for engagement is through the incarnational living of the members of every congregation. We desire to be agents of God's love for connecting Christians and congregations to that mission and encouraging them in their ministries.
- **Community**: "*Be devoted to one another in love*" (Romans 12:10) We desire to build community among the congregations, individuals and partners of our Fellowship, so that we can be agents of God's reconciliation in the world.

The Vision Team report also calls for four areas of focus: showing mercy and seeking justice, nurturing healthy congregations, empowering laity for missional living, and clarifying identity and covenant.

I hope you will take time to read and reflect on each of these commitments and areas of focus.
