Deacon Retreat Update, Part Two

Last Friday, the diaconate and I met for "Deacon Retreat, Part 2." We continued to brainstorm over how Crabtree Church might grow (both numerically and in spiritual maturity and wholeness) in the four main categories of *Relationships* (beyond and within our four walls), *Sunday Mornings*, *Visibility*, and *Programs*. As we continue these conversations, we will keep the

congregation informed and ask for your feedback. Your feedback is important because the Spirit is alive and moving in and among the people of Crabtree Church – not just in one person or in a small group of people, but among the body of believers.

In addition to the items I wrote about in the May 5 newsletter, I would like to share two more important items that came out of the retreat. First, we noticed that while we have a lot of opportunities for children, youth and senior adults, there is a void in the activities that Crabtree offers for young adults. I am going to meet with the young adults of the church over the summer, asking them to think about what kind of programs or activities they might like see at Crabtree and if there is something they think their unchurched friends might also enjoy.

Secondly, the diaconate voted unanimously on a proposed "Values Statement" to present to the congregation. Crabtree Church already has a "Mission Statement" which is printed on the front of the bulletin every Sunday. "We exist to be a fellowship of believers growing in faith; loving and serving others; and proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ." This is a general statement that expresses why Crabtree Church exists in the first place. A "Values Statement" is more specific. It distinguishes us from other local churches by expressing what our key behaviors and priorities are as we live out our mission. Here is the proposed statement:

As we walk together in pursuit of our mission, we VALUE:

Worship, prayer, and Bible study
Music ministry
Building and growing relationships
Celebrating and welcoming our differences
Generosity through our gifts and service
Missions near and far
Outreach in the local community

This statement will also be posted on the bulletin board near the church office and discussed at the June business meeting. Please take time to pray over this and share your thoughts with me or one of the deacons.
