

Deacon Retreat Update

Last Saturday, the diaconate and I met for a day-long retreat. Ernie also joined us for about an hour. The focus of our retreat was on "growth initiative" (numerical growth as well as growing in spiritual maturity and wholeness).

We talked about how it is important for a church to establish a clear mission, values, and vision as described in a book that we read prior to the retreat titled "Grace in the Heights: A Fable of Revitalization" by Rodger Price. I have described in more detail how we will establish "mission, values, and vision" on the second page of the newsletter.

We also began conversations on growth in the four "main categories" of: *Relationships* (beyond and within our four walls), *Sunday Mornings*, *Visibility*, and *Programs*. In thinking about how we might establish relationships beyond our four walls, we studied a demographics report for the population that surrounds Crabtree Church. We will continue to discuss this and all four of these "main categories" in more depth at our next retreat on Friday, May 23 from 5:00pm – 9:00pm.

Here are some items that came out of Saturday's retreat: 1) Refreshing the *Nursery*. Beth J. and Barbara B. will initiate the task of cleaning up the nursery and finding volunteers to serve on Sunday mornings in order to provide a safe and welcoming space for young families. 2) Enhance the Worship Service by Sitting Closer Together. When we roped off the back pews at the Maundy Thursday service, several worshipers commented on how much they liked sitting closer together. Doing this on Sundays will make it easier for us to "pass the peace." It should encourage people to sing louder, enhancing our music and worship. The congregation will also look and feel fuller and more inviting. I will be in the Ben Best classroom after worship again this Sunday to answer questions. We plan to rope off the back section of the sanctuary starting May 18. This will start on a trial basis for 2 months. 3) Music Enrichment. Look for a survey in your Sunday bulletin that asks for your 5 favorite songs for worship. Complete it to let Ernie know which songs you like to sing. 4) Establishing Clear Values and Vision. We are in the process of developing a list of our "values" which will soon be presented to the congregation for your feedback and vote. After that, we will work on a "vision" statement.

We felt lifted up by your prayers on Saturday. Thank you! Please continue to share your ideas with us and keep on praying.

Deacon Retreat Update, continued

Mission: A church's "mission" describes the reason an organization exists in the first place. The congregation voted to retrain our mission statement when Dr. Lolley was the interim pastor. From September – November of last year, we had a sermon series titled "Living our Mission" that explored each part of our mission statement. The congregation shared their thoughts by writing them down on "leaves." Our current mission statement is: "We exist to be a fellowship of believers growing in faith; loving and serving others; and proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ."

Values: "Values spell out the highest priorities for how a particular organization goes about doing its work." This is where a church expresses its key behaviors as they live out their mission. Loving relationships, creativity, hospitality, powerful music, informal worship, highly structured worship, and strong outreach are examples of "values." When a church has a clear set of values, visitors (and members) get a clear sense of who the church is and what their priorities are. The diaconate is in the process of establishing a list of values to present to the congregation for input and feedback.

Vision: "Vision is a picture of what a church is working to achieve over the coming months or years. Vision describes the best way a church can live out its mission and values in its current context." After establishing a list of values, the diaconate hopes to work on establishing a clearly written vision statement.
