Some fishing stories are hard to believe but there are pictures to prove this one. What I am about to share may just be a "once in the history of mankind" kind of story. You have no doubt heard stories of fish jumping into boats but you have probably never heard a story like this one.

Tom Satre not only shared the story but he shared his pictures with the Sitka, Alaska Gazette to back up his story.
