THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

There is an old adage that says, "The world was made for the body, the body was made for the soul, and the soul was made for God. St. Augustine recognized this truth and said, "Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it finds its rest in thee."

The central message of the Gospel is John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son than whosoever believeth in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

The deepest need that mankind has is eternal security and that need can only be met by a loving God who sent his son into the world to save us from our sins. It ought to catch our attention that it is not the will of God that any soul should perish or that any soul would be separated from him for all eternity.

While we are quick to quote John 3:16, the verses that follow are equally important. "For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. He that believeth on him is not condemned; but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God." (vs. 17-18)

In this Christmas Season, we must not be distracted from this truth by an over emphasis on Christmas decorations, giving and receiving presents and fulfilling our covetous desires for material things. We must not be deceived into thinking that Christmas is about us rather than about Him and his desire to save us from our sins and from ourselves.

Over the triple doorways of Milan Cathedral are inscriptions spanning the arches. Above one is carved a wreath of roses, with the words, "All that pleases is but for a moment." Over the second is a cross, with the words, All that troubles is but for a moment." Underneath the great central entrance to the main aisle is inscribed, "That only is important which is eternal." If we believe this truth, let us live it and share it.
