One of the devotions I read this week had to do with the value of touch in our lives. I remember a time when I was a little girl and I cut the bottom of my foot rather badly. I still have the scar on my heel. I remember the incident

vividly. I even remember the sensation of falling to the ground. In an instant, it seemed, my dad was running around the corner of the house to investigate. I remember feeling him gather me up in his arms to take me into the

house. I was about 6 or 7. My dad was not one to react strongly to too much of anything and this was no exception. He gently washed out the wound, all the while reassuring me and telling me what he was doing. He explained that he was going to put a "pressure" bandage on it which freaked me out a little – I knew what pressure was. But it didn't increase the pain; it just stopped the bleeding.

Being calm and compassionate was just a part of my Dad's personality. When my brother went in for his first cancer surgery, he waited calmly in the waiting room with my sister-in-law. Even when she pushed her way into the recovery room he calmly followed her, directing the staff with his eyes to leave her alone. When he called me to tell me that Mom had a very serious heart attack, he just reported the facts without letting on how worried he must have been. During a visit with us, he showed the same kind of attitude when Doug was hit in the jaw by a baseball. Doug doesn't remember him gently talking to him and rubbing his jaw with his hand, but I do.

Although he wasn't a particularly demonstrative man, Dad knew how important touch could be. He was sensitive to the feelings of others and had a talent for determining how you were really feeling, even over the phone. His voice could calm the nerves and his touch could draw the pain out. He sounds kind of supernatural, doesn't he? He wasn't. He was just a parent who knew how important the idea of him being there could be. Dad's been gone 14 years now and thinking about him can still calm my nerves. I can't physically feel his hugs but I remember the comfort they brought. God wants us to rely on Him for comfort too. He is available to us any time we need to call on Him. No, our skin will not feel His touch but our hearts can. When our lives become a jumbled up mess, we can just hand our problems to Him and admit "Here, God. I just can't handle things by myself any more". If you can do that, you can experience the touch of God on your heart. Then simply talking to God (and listening to Him) will help with your problems. He will guide you to do the right things. Similarly, when there is occasion for great joy in your life, His touch is important too. He can let you know that He rejoices right along with you. Because of His touch, you can experience the joy more fully and deeply. God is great, isn't He?
