Do things in your life ever make you want to jump up and shout "Do over!"? It's like when you're playing a game of driveway basketball and nobody can tell if there was a foul or not. So you just decide to have a "do over" and replay the point. There are lots of times when we can take advantage of a "do over" situation.

I have probably "unsewn" a good percentage of the seams that I have sewn. In fact, my personal rule when sewing is that if I didn't trim it, then I can pick out any seam and do it over again. It would be nice if everything came with an opportunity for a "do over" if we are not pleased with it. There are things that can't ever really be undone; things like harsh words or poor life choices. Sure, you can apologize or perhaps even try to go back and substitute a good choice for a bad one. But you can't undo the memory of hurt feelings or consequences of poor choices. You may eventually end up ok but the pain is not going to be forgotten.

In view of all of these realities of life, it was wonderful to hear Nola speak of the total and complete forgiveness. For us, even though we believe we have been forgiven, it is difficult to imagine ever erasing the memory of sin. Yet we are taught that when we ask for forgiveness, God forgives us. As humans we can never really understand how complete that forgiveness really is. It's as though God erases our sins like the old Etch-a-Sketch toy. You hold it upside down, give it a shake and the image is completely gone. It's as if it was never there in the first place. That is amazing to me. Ok, there isn't anything about God that isn't amazing. Our God is truly an Awesome God.
