"It is good to praise the Lord ... For you make glad by your deeds, O Lord; I sing for joy at works of your hands." Psalm 92:1a-4 (NIV)

There are so many times when this is easy to do! Autumn is my favorite time of year. Watching the leaves change and drop somehow gives me a feeling of contentment. It's something we can count on every year, an obvious signal that the season is changing. Here in North Carolina, the Seasons sort of merge seamlessly into the next without any real mark of change. Even in Spring, a warm Winter can coax flowers out of

the ground prematurely only to be bitten back by frost. Leaves in Fall may not be as bright from one year to the next but they do change and fall to the ground every year; without fail. Then there are our families to cause us to give thanks and praise God. It seems that people are encouraged to consider others as the days drift closer to Christmas and that is certainly something that makes us glad in this harsh world.

But what about those days which bring us sorrow? What about recent days that saw senseless killings in Washington, DC or loss of life in the floods in Colorado? How can we praise God on those days? Obviously, we can focus on those heroic people who rush to help those in need. There are medical personnel, law enforcement, fire departments and any number of nameless brave souls who put others' needs before their own. God placed those individuals specifically there for a reason, presumably to assist. Praise God for those people!

I think that we often forget to praise God for just being our God. We think about that aspect at Christmas and Easter but I suspect that we spend the rest of the year thanking Him for gifts and blessings. That's important, of course, but there is more. We are accepted by God as His children and as His children, we can go to Him for anything. Without Him, there is no hope. NO HOPE. I can't think of words that express the magnitude of the blessing that God has given us by just being our God. In like fashion, I can't think of a word that would describe the feeling of utter hopelessness that would exist were He not available to us. It is humbling to be unable to express in words something that is felt so strongly. But we can still praise God for His connection to us. We can express our feelings to Him because when we fail to find the words, He understands. He knows what's in our hearts. We can still praise God when something happens that may cause us to say "If there is a God, then why..." It would go something like, "Praise God that He is in my heart to help me cope with ... I am blessed beyond measure."
