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I'm headed for the beach again this afternoon. I am fortunate enough to have a daughter who not only has a place at Atlantic Beach but also has a son who occasionally needs more than one set of eyes watching him. This is not a problem for me since I love going to the beach.

What makes the beach so special? I don't actually remember seeing the beach until I was about 10 or 11 years old. Until then, we used our precious vacation time to see relatives and spend time on our boat at the Chesapeake Bay. And then it happened. My parents, my aunt and uncle and my 2 cousins took off for Myrtle Beach. From our home in Virginia it was 7-8 hours in a car with no AC but it was worth it!! My first exposure to beach life was the crowded sand and noisy arcades of Myrtle Beach – and as a kid, I loved it. We made several more trips as a family as I grew up, including one to Nags Head. But it wasn't until after Steve and I were married that I discovered the gifts the sea really had to offer.

In the summer of 1977, Steve and I had our first real vacation together. We joined his family at Emerald Isle for a week. It was a great time to get to know each other and to just sit and enjoy the experience on the beach. Steve's nephews were with us and it was fun to help with them but there was also a lot of time to spend just sitting under the umbrella and listen to the waves. To me, that's the real treasure of going to the beach. I love to just sit and listen to waves splash and birds call. I love feeling the perpetual breezes that blow at the beach. I love feeling the warmth of the sun and listening to the kids laugh and play in the sand. Walking around the docks at Morehead City offers the gentle lapping of the water against the boats and the clamorous squawking of the sea gulls hoping for a treat. I especially love hearing my grandson shout, "Gigi, it's a 'copter." "Gigi, boat, boat!" "Gigi, bird!" Even sitting on the balcony listening to the rain is a good thing to me.

All of these sensory experiences remind us that there are things beyond ourselves. If you don't live at the beach, all these things are new and different. Vacations themselves offer us time to relax and get away from our usual routines. We don't feel guilty when we just sit and think and listen and feel. At the beach, it is easier to really appreciate the beauty of our world. We can see and experience the awesome wonders God has created for us. To me, it's a wonderful thing. God is so good to us!!
