

Youth Lock-in Oct 4-5

The Youth group is having a "lock-in" this weekend, beginning at 6:00pm on Friday, ending at approximately 11am Saturday morning. This Sunday, we will worship in an "ecumenical" spirit at Crabtree Valley Baptist Church by participating in World Communion Sunday. Ecumenical (ekyə menikəl) means the universal or world-wide church – in other words, the body of Christ that transcends denominational and geographical boundaries. To be ecumenical means to focus on Christian unity.

Each year, the first Sunday in October has been designated as the day when churches throughout the world and from all Christian traditions are invited to celebrate Holy Communion as a way to promote unity in Christ. World Communion Sunday originated in the Presbyterian Church in 1936 and has subsequently spread to other denominations. Today many, but not all, churches participate in it.

For the last two weeks we have been looking at what the apostle Paul says about gifts of the Holy Spirit. Typically, we think of these spiritual gifts as gifts given to individuals. But instead of thinking about individual believers, what if we were to ponder the diverse gifts that each denomination shares with the ecumenical church? For example, the Pentecostals do not let the rest of us forget about the power of the Holy Spirit. The Methodists contribute the rich songs of Charles Wesley and other great musicians as they are found in the hymns of that tradition. The Quakers witness to the fruitfulness of silence in worship. The Reformed and Presbyterian Churches emphasize God's sovereignty. And Baptists? What do Baptists contribute? It seems to me that a big contribution of Baptists is our emphasis on the doctrine of sola scriptura (scripture alone). This serves as a reminder of the importance of the preached Word and the proclamation of the gospel found in scripture.

While each denomination contributes to the universal church, this Sunday is a day when we celebrate our unity, joining other Christians throughout the world in celebrating Holy Communion. At the Lord's Table, we celebrate with Christians of various denominations, ethnicities, nationalities, and skin colors as we remember the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ. "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." (Ephesians 4:4-6)
