"LIVING OUR MISSION"

Between now and Advent, we are going to take a close look at the three main parts of our Mission Statement. We will prayerfully consider what it means and what it will mean for our congregation to be: "A Fellowship of Believers Growing in Faith"; "Loving and Serving Others"; "Proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ." It is exciting to think about the great things God is already doing and will do in the future at Crabtree Church. With God's help, the possibilities are endless!



The Hope Pantry volunteers will be having a meeting Monday, Sept. 16 at 12:30pm to discuss changes to the operation of the pantry. This meeting is open to anyone who would like to be involved in the pantry!



During the month of September we will be receiving the North Carolina Missions Offering. This offering provides funding for multiple ministries such as Baptist Men, the planting of new Churches and Evangelism, Mission Projects and the promotion of Missions Education.



Our message on Sunday was all about faith as a cornerstone of one's life. A cornerstone is defined as "the first stone laid at a corner where two walls begin and form the first part of a new building". I was unable to find a reference to any specific characteristics of a cornerstone except that the year of

construction may appear on the outside and the interior of the stone may be hollowed out

so as to encase pertinent documents (similar to a time capsule). Considering that one would want the walls to at least start out straight, there must be 90 degree angles involved somewhere. Most structures don't have a designated cornerstone, but nonetheless the quality and position of the stones (or bricks or blocks) at the corners of the building are critical to the lifespan of the building. It's easy to see how a firm basis of faith is critical to the quality of our walk through life.

I guess that might imply that being brought up in a church should suffice. That in itself is hardly enough. It's like building the walls of a house only halfway. The house is incomplete and unprotected from the elements. OK, then, going to church every Sunday should do it. And I'll make out a generous check for the offering plate to be sure all my friends know how devoted I am to my church. Then I can just keep on living the way I want carefree and irreverent. I don't want anyone to feel uncomfortable around me and my obvious Christian commitment. That should surely be good enough. Wait, what do you mean that's still not good enough? What more can I do? I have to do these things with a joyful attitude too? Why does attitude make a difference? A poor attitude can really do more harm than good. It's like building a wall by putting stones together or, instead, taking the stones and throwing each one individually to knock the wall down. You can make a monument from stones or you can choose to use them as weapons. Stones can build a dam that stops a river or a bridge that crosses it. These are all things that make how you choose to use your stones (your faith) so important. It's easy to see how doing unkind or thoughtless things can harm your Christian witness to others. It's harder to understand that even good things you do can affect how others see you as a Christian if they are done with a non-Christian attitude. Submitted by Linda Wheeler
