## THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Come apart before you fall apart. Jesus didn't actually say it that way but the message is the same. The crowds were pressing in on Jesus and his disciples. The stress was building up, weariness was setting in, emotionally, physically and spiritually it was time for a break. Pay attention to what is said in Mark 6:31, "And he (Jesus) said unto them (his disciples), come ye yourselves apart into a desert place, and rest a while, for there were many coming and going, and they had no leisure so much as to eat."

Pressure was building for Jesus and the disciples. Jesus recognized that they needed a break. They needed some leisure time. They needed to eat properly and most of all they needed rest and reprieve from the crowds and the daily routine.

We encourage you to find the time - no - make the time - to get away from your routine, see new things, visit new or even familiar places, visit with old friends, rest and renew your spirit.
