

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

You have been hearing me say for some time now that "We are a little church with a big heart". I sincerely believe that. Being small doesn't mean that we are helpless. Being small does not mean that we are insignificant; being small doesn't mean that we can't take on big projects. That fact was proven when we followed God's leadership in surrendering our Youth House to be used as a Welcome House for refugees. Remember the more that \$7000 dollars that was generously given in a

love offering to two members of our church who lost everything in an apartment fire. And how about the hygiene project where we provided over 100 hygiene kits to be used by Church World Services for victims of hurricanes. And how about the strong financial support that we gave to Cheryl and Andy on their recent mission trip to Guatemala.

The hill that we are now climbing to grow the church may seem steep but it is not impossible. In some ways we are like the little engine that could. Small things are important to God: a baby in a manger, a hair on the head that is numbered, His eye on the sparrow. Jesus spoke of the mustard seed, the widow's mite, a cup of water, a small boy's lunch of bread and fish, a small coin in the fish's mouth. And don't forget that Jesus went home with a small man named Zacchaeus.
