THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

"You don't change the world by looking at it. You change the world by the way you live in it." That quote comes from the movie "Aeronauts", which by the way, is worth watching during this time when we are homebound. The quote couldn't be more timely. It all boils down to one thing – responsible living.

Responsible living was assigned to mankind when God created man in His own image, placed him in a beautiful garden, gave him "dominion" over it and told him to take care of it. The word "dominion" is very significant. It means "rule or power to rule, sovereign Authority". In simple language, God put man in charge of the earth to manage it, to be responsible for it. In Christian circles we say that God made us stewards of the world and of our life and holds us accountable for what we do with both. From the word steward, we get the word "stewardship". It all has to do with responsible living.

In his insightful commentary on Hebrews, William Barclay explains the history behind the author's statement, "It is by faith that we understand that the world was fashioned by the Word of God, so that that which is seen came into being out of that which is unseen." In other words, God made the world out of nothing. Barclay says that it is an act of faith to believe that God made the world. "Hebrews insists that God did not work with existing material: God created the world from nothing."

The logic is clear. If God created the world out of nothing then everything in it is God's. God is the undisputed owner of the world. No wonder the song writer was inspired to write, "He's got the whole world in His hands.!" And if God is the undisputed owner of the world, He has the authority to authorize mankind to be the manager of it.

And therein lies the problem with so much that has gone wrong in our world. Man has proved to be a very poor manager. The first man and woman, Adam & Eve disgraced themselves and put us all in jeopardy by disobeying God's orders on how to take care of the Garden home he gave them. Willfully and deliberately they ate the forbidden fruit and brought sin and spiritual death into the picture.

Mankind has been missing the mark of God's high calling since that day of disobedience. We are paying the price now for our careless and thoughtless stewardship of the earth. Our own poor habits along with selfishness, self-centeredness and greed have impacted our environment, trashed our oceans, polluted our rivers and streams, and spread diseases across the planet. The world's inequality of wealth and food is man's doing. There is enough of everything in this world for everybody but everybody doesn't have enough of everything because of man's selfishness.

In this Season of Lent we are celebrating the death and resurrection of Jesus. He came to earth to die for our sins, to save us not just from our sins but from ourselves. God still owns this world and He is still in control. He still holds us accountable. I know that in times like these people might question that truth. But as Barclay put it, "If we believe that this is God's world then there comes the faith and the hope which enable us to do the most difficult thing in the world – to accept what we cannot understand. And if we truly believe that this is God's world we must also accept our responsibility in it. "You change the world by the way you live in it."
