

By Wednesday evening, Kathy and I will be experiencing, for the first time in 32 years, having an empty nest, at least for a couple of months.

My co-workers at hospice have been talking with me and reminding me of this for the past couple of weeks. They asked how I thought I would feel knowing there are no children in the home.
