
SECRETARY ON VACATION Tues, April 16 thru Mon, April 29

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

It's over. Easter is now behind us, at least on the calendar. My bet is that most of you went right back to your same homes, your same families, your same jobs, your same worries. The disciples, those who were fishermen, went right back to wetting their nets. Has anything changed in you?

Easter is now over....now what? Just the same old, same old, and the nets of your life are going to be full doing that? The crowds are now gone, the celebrations a distant memory. On this far side of Easter which is the only side we have, instead of going back.. .back to doing it the way you've always done it and living life the way you've always lived it, giving yourself to what is robbing you of life, why not live as those Christ is alive. Why not let Christ be living in you? Why not live as if Easter is true and the presence of the resurrected Christ makes everything different.
